SERMON FOCUS: True love of God is both internal and external.

SERMON FUNCTION: The hearer will understand that love of God should color what they feel and do.

BACKGROUND: Deuteronomy was written by Moses toward the end of the time of the Exodus from Egypt. It was the giving of the law to God's people right before they were going into the promised land, and it was telling them how they were to live as God's chosen people.

SCRIPTURE READING: Deuteronomy 6:1-9

INTRODUCTION:

Do we obey out of love or fear?

MESSAGE:

- 1. THE LORD GOD IS THE ONLY ONE WORTHY OF OUR WORSHIP
 - a. (4) "Listen, Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one."
 - b. This is the introduction to the Jewish Statement of Faith called the Shema.
 - c. There is only one God.
 - i. He is the Creator
 - ii. He is the Sustainer
 - He is the only God who is actually real.
 - d. If we worship another god, it is an insult. Worship of another god is saying "You are not enough."
 - e. We are designed to worship, and we will worship. We must choose the right Object of our worship!
 - f. There are lots of things competing with God for our worship.
 - g. In truth, we cannot divide our loyalty between God and someone else because...

2. WE ARE TO LOVE GOD WITH ALL OUR BEING

- a. (5) "Love the Lord yourGod with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength."
- b. There is a reasonable chance that you are better acquainted with Jesus saying these words (Mark 12:28-34; Matt. 22:34-40; Luke 10:25-28) in response to the question from the Pharisees "What is the greatest command." The second like it comes from Leviticus 19:18, "Love your neighbor as yourself."
- c. This is why in verse 6, we are told that "these words are to be in your heart."
- d. Love of God is to permeate our thinking, our feeling, and as a result, our actions.
- e. Love of God requires deliberate effort, in spite of how we may feel.
- f. Love of God requires changing our desires to suit His, not the other way around.
- g. Love of God means giving up the evil that you may entertain in your heart and making room for only Him and His will.
- h. Love of God is not just internal, however. It is to be visible to others.

3. OUR LOVE FOR GOD SHOULD BE OBVIOUS TO OTHERS

- a. (6-7) "Repeat them (these words) to your children. Talk about them when you sit down in your house and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up."
 - i. When our love for God is real, He should dominate our conversations.
 - 1. Tell your children how good He is to you.
 - 2. Tell your friends when you're out.
 - 3. Talk about God with your family.
 - 4. If your heart really belongs to Him, you'll talk about Him! You'll think about Him morning, noon, and night.
 - 5. God's love doesn't just result in visible obedience, it results in
 - ii. When our love for God is real, we recognize His presence everywhere and we recognize His goodness in all situations.
- b. (8) "Bind them as a sign on your hand"
 - i. The hand symbolizes "doing". All our deeds should reflect our love of God.
 - ii. (Rom. 6:12-13) "Therefore do not let sin reign in your mortal body, so that you should obey its desires. And do not offer any parts of it to sin as weapons for unrighteousness."
 - iii. Having the word of God as a symbol on your hand would be a reminder to not use your hand to sin.
- c. (9) "Let them be a symbol on your forehead."
 - i. This is intended to keep the word of God in front of your eyes so that you do not submit your eyes to evil.
 - ii. The eyesight is where lust starts, and it is entertained in the heart.
 - iii. (Job 31:1) "I have made a covenant with my eyes"
 - iv. Not only should God's word be in front of your eyes, It should be visible to others in your face.
 - v. If you have the joy of the Lord, people will see it and will want it too! Then you will need to share the gospel with them.
- 4. THE GOSPEL IN SIMPLE FORM (adapted from Dr. James Merritt).
 - a. Bad News: We are all sinners separated from God.
 - b. Worst News: There is nothing we can do about our sin problem.
 - c. Good News: Christ did for us what we cannot do for ourselves.
 - d. Best News: Salvation and eternal life are a free gift, but you must receive it.
