Eilenburg became a refugee city, afflicted with famine, disease, and war. During the height of that plague, Rinckart conducted as many as 50 funerals a week. To be a supposed which appears

He spent most of his resources helping other people. Somewhere around 1636 he wrote this poem for his family to sing as grace before eating, giving God thanks for the meager scraps of food that passed for a meal.

As we think about celebrating Thanksgiving, there may be pain felt as well: that loved one who isn't here this year; that one who received bad news recently. Then there is that one in the crowd who wants to proffer his political views, ready to pick a fight.

Let's remember all the ways God has blessed us in the past year: we live in a country where we can freely worship with fellow believers; loved by our heavenly Father; with the promise of eternal life through the sacrifice Jesus made on the cross, taking our sins, our burdens, our sorrows. We have the Holy Spirit, always speaking to us, encouraging us, directing us ... if we listen and allow Him to guide us.

Read this text again with courage and conviction.


